## About the apartment

For the next months of your life you will be living in an apartment at Nurmenpolku. Don't worry, it is full of life. There are two bedrooms, a bigger and a smaller one, as well as a shared living room with a spare bed for guests and a possible summer volunteer. Mostly in summer the organisation has a summer volunteer for about two months. The living room has a TV and a sofa as well as a balcony. For the TV you can either rent DVD's from the city library, which is not far away, or you can connect your laptop with an HDMI cabel. Then there is the kitchen with everything you need, just be prepared to do the dishes, because there is no dishwasher, but a typical Finnish drying reck. The baking trays are under the oven.

If you have questions: Ask us

This apartment is a great place, full of little features from all the previous volunteers and



it has everything you need (if not you can always ask Mauri and Anu) including a fondue from the volunteers before us and a muffin form that we bought. It's nice that all of the volunteers personalized the apartment a bit. Maybe you can add to that.

Anyway, if you have any questions concerning the apartment or anything else, feel free to contact us! :) We can now tell you how to change the light in the bathroom if it starts flickering again.;)

Like the other volunteers we are going to leave our instagram for that in the guest book (by the way: Have a look at the guestbook and maybe let your visitors add to it as well).

I think, you'll manage just fine with the apartment, we also did, just in case you ever wonder wether you have a basketball in the apartment (in the basket next to the front door) or spikes and a reflector band maybe for running (in the storage room), I am happy to help.:) Instagram: stine.rohwer

Ps: The washing machine stays on for a while after you used it. Meaning you can do multiple washes with just 2 Euros if you time it correctly.

There is a typical Finnish filter coffee machine (Finns mostly drink filtered coffee), a toaster, a microwave, kettle, fridge, freezer, baking utensils and a pro tip: When you have guests move the kitchen table to the middle of the room.:) In case you saw that you have sauna scheduled in your calander every Friday, this is how that works: There is a sauna down in your building. When you enter the building, you'll find a door on the right and the left side of the hall. On the right side there are the bikes. You have one mountainbike and one city bike. Make Anu and Sari happy and don't forget your helmets. Anyway, behind the door on the left side of the hall you'll find another hall. The second door on the right is the entry to the sauna. You can use it during your scheduled time on Friday, when it's booked for you. Don't worry, you'll learn about sauna during your sauna workshop at the On-Arrival-Training. The last door on the right side of the hall where you also find the sauna is the washing room. You'll need an extra key for that which hangs by the coatreck in your apartment. The other doors as well as the front door you can open with your apartment key. For the washing machine you need two 1 Euro coins (best if you change money at the theater). The dryer is free.

You should feel free to decorate the apartment, since it'll be your home for the next few months - and also have friends over.:)



## Check the storage room

Our tip, before you feel like something is missing:

Check the storage room!
A little list of things you can find there:

- two 1kg weights
- a yoga matress
- a fake Christmas tree
- an ironing board + an iron
- a lot of spare blankets and matresses
- ice skates
- pink butt sliders
- an air pump for the bikes
- two more helmets
- some decorations for Halloween, Christmas and birthday's
- a scale
- some jackets and boots that were left in the apartment

## Your work places



## City Nuokkari

In the Youth Centre you're gonna work a lot with Emil and Marianne. It is only 5 minutes by foot from your apartment. Apart from nice events like sleepovers and holiday celebrations, where you're free to dress up or bake, there are a lot of handcrafts at the Youth Center. You can make cards, buttons and reflectors with the children. Or you play billiard, pingpong, Skip.Bo and so on. Maybe you can figure out the Virtual Reality glasses and try them out.



#### Loimaan teatteri

At the Loimaan teatteri you'll sometimes have to work a lot when there are shows and you'll help with preperations. Other times there is not really anything to do, so you might help by sorting out the props room. But there are always the kids group with whom you can do warm ups and character work, so prepare to be creative in games.







### Alastaro

You might spend your Tuesdays in the Youth Center in Alastaro with Emil (like we did). Alastaro is part of Loimaa, although you have to drive there for about 20 minutes. We just started renovating the pingpong room. Just be prepared to spend most of the hours with sunlight in a basement without windows, because in winter your working hours will collide with that.



### Outdoor theater

In the summer months the theater work mostly takes place in the outdoor theater, which is a bit further away. Since we are making this mainly in February, we haven't been there much ourselves, so we can't tell you about it. Sorry!



# Events at the workplace

- Rainbow Club/Cafè once a month (every first Saturday of the month) we started having the Rainbow Cafè here in Loimaa, where some of Loimaa's youth, as well as people from all around, come and join for some good food, music, a little activity and some pride talk and stickers
- sleepovers every once in a while you might have a sleepover at the Youth House where you do some activities with the children, sing some karaoke or dance and have breakfast the next morning
- bring in your own ideas the Youth House is a great place to do some things you want to do, some of our examples are: cultural evenings on Fridays, celebrating Carneval and more! (Check out our Instagram for more, we kept it updated!)

## Highlights of Loimaa



### K-Citymarket

In Loimaa you'll pretty much find three big grocerie stores: Prisma, Lidl and K-Citymarket. You'll get an account in K-Citymarket where you can buy everything from your normal groceries over clothes and toothpaste up to Legos. If you, however, have a weak spot for red cabbage or fruit tea, we advice you to go to Prisma. If you're vegetarian or vegan, try the first big freezer on the right. There you'll find patties for great burgers. Also in the fridge isles you'll find a bit more meat alternatives and there is a great no chicken fajita mix by the tacos. Also don't forget your vitamins, they're in the store, so you don't have to buy them in the pharmacy (which is, by the way, in the same building). The post office is there as well. Good to know is that packages don't get delivered to your apartment, but you'll get a card or email saying that you have something to pick up from the post office. The grocerie stores are open on sundays, btw, if you're like us and didn't expect that. Basically the whole week. And postcards are also delivered on Sundays.

### Secondhand stores

There are two second hand stores in Loimaa. In the one that's further away, our personal favourite, you can find a lot of good and cheap stuff. Just don't forget to bring cash. You can withdraw money at the ATM at K-Citymarket or Prisma. At the other second hand store you can pay with card.



#### Watertower

Only a few minutes away, behind the football field and the small forest, is a great place to try and watch the northern lights or go sledding. Even at night the stairs have lights.

### What more?

Loimaa has a bowling alley and the statue park (where some of the summer volunteers have helped out)



The coast in Rauma is about an hour drive away.





# How to get out of Loimaa

- there is a bus You can also buy the tickets in an app for that. The bus also stops at the train station.
- the bikes (for a camping trip) You can also use the bikes to get to Hirvikoski (about 5km away) where you can go to the gym or the swiming hall twice a week.
- go with friends (who have a car) On Sundays you can also join Sari for sauna and a swim in the lake in Mellilä, if you make friends with the Leko volunteers, they can usually lend a car from the school.



# Updating on social media

For your time as a volunteer here in Loimaa you'll continue updating the social media account just like we are and just like the volunteers before us did. You'll get the lock-in data for instagram and the posts you do there will automatically be on facebook as well. You can also already have a look at the account and see what we and the other volunteers did here in our time. When you make friends at the On-Arrival Training, you can follow them on their accounts and see what they are doing in their volunteering, too.

You should post about once a week, make a post or a story and in the end use the give hashtags which you will find in our posts.

Don't forget to change your names in the discription of the account. Currently there are our names.

The account is also a nice way for your friends and family to see what you are doing here.

## Tips from volunteers

Most of our tipps for you are gonna be as always - easier said than done, but try it anyway:

There is not too much to do in Loimaa, so try to make some friends and hang out with them. Try to travel a bit, maybe visit the other volunteers. You can also do things you always wanted to, like learn how to knit or do a sourdough starter. Learn to find things to do by yourself like reading, sports, painting or facetime with your friends and family.

Regarding your work, try to bring in own ideas and projects. Sometimes the children are a bit shy or are doing their own stuff, but if you planned something like making friendship bracelets, do it anyway and hope/wait for the children to join you.

Another nice thing is to kind of document your journey here. You can write a diary, letters to yourself, make a video diary, post about it or make a little video/documentation.
